BEAUREGARD, THE CAT (Roberta Pantal) #1002

Beauregard loves Rebecca more than anyone in the whole wide world. But then he meets Samantha, a beautiful black and white cat with a pink nose. A classic animal love story that Grade two's will enjoy.

BEEZUS AND RAMONA (Beverly Cleary) #1004

Beezus tries very hard to be patient with her little sister, but four-year-old Ramona has the habit of doing the most unpredictable, annoying, embarrassing things in the world. How many nine-year old girls have to put up with a silly little sister in rabbit ears hopping after them and causing all sorts of trouble? Sometimes Beezus doesn't like Ramona very much, and that makes her feel very guilty. Sisters are supposed to love each other, but pesky little Ramona doesn't seem very loveable to Beezus right now.

BEST CHRISTMAS PAGEANT EVER, THE (Barbara Robinson) #1003- set 1, #2724-set 2

Thanks to the Herdmans, this year's Sunday School Christmas pageant is a highly unconventional production. An under privileged family of bullies, the Herdman's decide they want to be cast in the pageant's important roles. Their astonished reactions at hearing the Christmas story for the first time causes everyone involved to view Christmas in a much different manner. Hilarious. Heart warming.

BRIDGE TO TERABITHIA (Katherine Paterson) #1005

Jess and his new neighbour Leslie create an imaginary kingdom called Terabithia where creativity and recognition of each other's worth are valued. In this symbolic world, Jess's daily frustrations with his teacher's rigid thinking and his family's lack of acceptance are dealt with and defeated. Jess sees that Leslie's family have no narrow gender definitions and that in their eyes his artistic ability is praiseworthy. When Leslie dies accidentally, Jess's father helps him find the inner resources to accept her death and continue his non-conformist pursuits. Extremely well drawn characterization and use of symbolism.

BURMA BOY (Willis Lindquist) #1006

Deep in the jungles of Burma, Haji seeks to find the beloved elephant, Majda Koom, that his father had trained many years ago. Something had scared Majda Koom and he returned to the jungles as a wild elephant and was now destroying rice fields and villages. The elders think that only Haji can find the mighty elephant and tame him again. It is a mighty task for a young boy.

CALL IT COURAGE (Armstrong Sperry) #1007

A survival story in which a tragic childhood experience has caused Mafatu to fear the sea. On his tropical island, where going to sea for food is every man's lifework, Mafatu's fear is seen as cowardice and an embarrassment to his family. His decision to journey away from the island in order to overcome his fear and prove his courage is the framework for an exciting story that probes the question of what constitutes bravery.

CASEY AND THE GREAT IDEA (Joan Lowry Nixon)

Casey always has great ideas, like the time she suggests to the principal that the boys' and girls' sports be combined-and he calls her a troublemaker. Or when she tries to make her mother take typing so she can get a job-but her mother hates to type. Or when she tries to raise money so her friend Sylvia can go back to school-and Sylvia turns out to be a bank robber in disguise! But Casey keeps trying and, at last, she's sure her newest plan is foolproof. Except this time, Casey uncovers a real-life, big-time mystery-with lots of big-time trouble!

CAY, THE (Theodore Taylor)

#1034

Phillip had looked down upon black people. As a refugee from a shipwreck, Phillip, blinded in the disaster, is dependent on a black man, Timothy. The Cay tells of their struggle for survival and Phillip's efforts to adjust to blindness.

CHARLIE & THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY (Roald Dahl)

#1172

This novel is a richly inventive and humorous tale of the adventures of five children at large in a chocolate factory.

Five children- and only five – were going to be allowed into Mr. Willy Wonka's chocolate factory -the factory where the worlds most wonderful chocolate was made. There was Augustus Gloop – a fat pig of a boy who would eat anything he could get his hands and teeth on: Veruca Salt – a spoiled little rich girl who screamed until she was brought her hearts latest delight; Violet Beauregarde – the world's champion gum chewer who was destined for a sticky end; Mike Teavee – a smart aleck who's addicted to television and Charlie Bucket – our hero was honest, obedient, loyal, trustworthy, brave, good, kind ---and starving.

It's an off beat fantasy that will mean many things to many readers – a classroom favourite.

CHARLOTTE'S WEB (E.B. White)

#1199

A children's classic, this charming tale describes the friendship between Wilbur the pig, and his two benefactors, an empathetic young girl and a talented, enigmatic spider. Fern and Charlotte are both instrumental in keeping Wilbur alive. This is a well-written presentation of highly individualized characters who contrast true, lasting friendship with pragmatic, expedient association. The book also comments on society's gullible acceptance of the printed word. A beautiful sustained fantasy.

CHOCOLATE FEVER (Robert Kimmel Smith)

#1194

Henry Green eats chocolate for breakfast, dinner, and supper. Henry is horrified one day when he breaks out all over in large chocolate bumps. Through a chance meeting with a candy distributor, Henry discovers not only the cure for chocolate fever, but a lesson in self-control. A funny, cautionary tale.

COULD DRACULA LIVE IN WOODFORD? Mary Howarth) (Canadian) #1035

Things are not always as they seem. This is the lesson Jennie and Beth learn from their investigation of the neighbourhood recluse, Mr. McIver. After snooping around his home for days, hoping to find clues that Mr. McIver is a vampire, the girls discover that Dracula is a fictional character and that Mr. McIver's actions are related to his blindness. The girls are aided by Sam, a junk-food eating dog, who is able to communicate with Jennie. Narrated in the 3rd person, this funny mystery shifts its point of view between Sam and Jennie.

DIFFERENT DRAGONS (Jean Little) (Canadian) #1107

Ben is afraid of many things - the dark, lightning storms and dogs. On a weekend visit with his aunt, Ben meets and conquers these fears. When faced with an unexpected guest, Gully, the friendly Labrador retriever, Ben's feelings are turned from paralysing terror to curiosity, and finally loving trust. As his father has commented on the trip to Aunt Rose's house, everyone has different dragons to fight. Ben discovers even the seemingly fearless girl, Hana Uchida, who lives next door, is afraid of heights. When the two become trapped high up in the attic, Ben is able to empathize with Hana and to help her slay her dragon, too.

DOG FOR KEEPS, A (Lynnette Tamar Mark) (Canadian) #1108

This story is set in northern Saskatchewan, where the Herman family raises, trains, and sells Alaskan malamutes or sled dogs. The young daughter, Ivy, is already an accomplished dog team driver or "musher". The conflict begins when Ivy's father tells her they must sell her favourite lead dog, Snow Queen, because the family needs money to put electricity into their cabin. Ivy argues with her father but agrees to give up the dog. Later she takes the team out for one last run, with Snow Queen in the lead. The tension builds rapidly when a blizzard hits and a wolf pack howls nearby. But Snow Queen uses all her skill to find the route home. Ivy happily learns that her father has decided not to sell the dog that has saved his daughter's life.

EIGHTEENTH (18TH) EMERGENCY, THE (Betsy Byars) #1193

Ezzie knows 17 strategies for surviving jungle emergencies, but he needs to find a plan to help Benjie handle the neighbourhood bully. When Benjie decides on his own to face his fears even though he knows this means certain pain, his sudden maturity surprises everyone. A very funny book about a subject that many young students consider a serious problem. Easy reading.

END HOUSE (Celeste Sowden) #1110

This mystery novel is set in Australia and tells of the mysterious adventures of a brother and sister who are determined to find out the truth about a dilapidated house and its strange inhabitants. Correlates well with another Grade 6 mystery novel, MYSTERY HOUSE, and the SHIVER OF MYSTERY unit in JOURNEYS.

FACE-OFF IN MOSCOW (Scott Young) (Canadian) #1153

Ozzie's idea for a Canada-Russia school hockey series seems like an impossibility until Ozzie overcomes his fear of public speaking to promote the exchange trip. Soon his team finds itself facing off at centre ice in Moscow. A mix-up at their hotel becomes an unforeseen benefit. As Canadian players stay in Russian Players' homes, friendships blossom. A fast-paced sports narrative, this brief story describes good sportsmanship, expert goal-tending, and an enjoyable lesson about how students the world over experience the same dreams and frustrations.

FRECKLE JUICE (Judy Blume)

#1174

They cover his face , his ears, and the whole back of his neck. Sitting behind him in class, Andrew once counted eighty-six of them-and that was just a start! If Andrew had freckles like Nicky, his mother would never know if his neck was dirty. One day after school, Andrew works up enough courage to ask Nicky where he got his freckles. When know-it-all Sharon overhears, she offers Andrew her secret freckle juice recipe-for fifty cents. It's a lot of money, but Andrew is desperate. At home, he carefully mixes the strange combination of ingredients. Then the unexpected happens...

FROM ANNA (Jean Little) (Canadian)

#1114

Anna can't do anything right. She's clumsy and slow. Her hair ribbons are always coming undone. She can't read or spell, and now that the family has moved from Germany to Canada, Anna is the only one not speaking English. Her brothers and sisters have a name for her, Awkward Anna. The nickname hurts Anna, but she pretends not to care. Then one day Anna realizes there is a reason for her clumsiness, and her whole world begins to change.

FROM THE MIXED-UP FILES OF MRS. BASIL E. FRANKWEILER

(E.L. Konigsburg)

#1115

Claudia and Jamie have a grand adventure by running away and hiding in the Metropolitan Museum of Art. They find a mystery and after diligent research they uncover a secret.

FROZEN FIRE (James Houston) (Canadian)

#1195

Based in part on a true and perilous journey, this dramatic story of desperate survival gives a vivid sense of the traditional Eskimo way of life, which is now changing, and of its continuing values in the contemporary world. To Matthew Morgan's father, a prospecting geologist, the next expedition was always going to yield a great discovery of some rare mineral. Too eager to wait for a massive Arctic storm to pass, Mr. Morgan and his pilot set out - and failed to return. When bad weather continued to prevent an air search, Matthew and his Inuit friend, Kayak, went off by snowmobile on a secret search for the missing men. Struggling against bone-chilling wind storms, starvation, wild beasts, and wild men living in the wilderness, the two boys battled for life.

GOOEY, CHEWY CONTEST (Howard Goldsmith)

#1118

Gabi's school is holding a bubble-blowing contest_and Gabi doesn't think he can win against Joselito, the tallest boy in his class, who blows the biggest bubbles. Then Gabi remembers his uncle, the inventor. Maybe Uncle Teo can help. Who will win the contest makes for an exciting story for Grade 2.

GRAMPA'S ALKALI (Jo Bannatyne-Cugnet)

#1117

Maybe it's just a little too much curiosity. Maybe it's just bad luck. But whatever it is, ten-year-old James Johnston can't seem to keep out from under Grampa's feet. It's not just the colour of his hair, which gained the tow-headed disaster area the nickname Alkali. The white curse on the land known all too well to farm families is the ruination of fertile soil, and a pest you can't do a whole lot about. That's Alkali all right! But Grampa and young James' undeniable bond proves to be a lifeline when out of the clear blue prairie sky danger strikes and James must find the courage to be a hero.

GREAT GILLY HOPKINS, THE (Katherine Paterson)

#1119

This book traces the change in attitude of a foster child who is placed in a loving family setting. Gilly, at first rebellious, grows to love her withdrawn foster brother, William Ernst, her frumpy foster mother, and Mr. Randolph, a poetry-loving neighbour. Gilly eventually realizes that the mother she has idolized will never want to care for her, and that Gilly prefers her present foster home, where she has finally found what love involves.

HARRIET THE SPY (Louise Fitzhugh)

#1120 & #1200

Harriet the Spy has a secret notebook that she fills with utterly honest jottings about her parents, her classmates, and her neighbours. Every day on her spy route she "observes" and writes down anything of interest to her. But when Harriet's notebook is found by her schoolmates, their anger and retaliation and Harriet's unexpected responses explode in a hilarious way.

HEY CHICKEN MAN (Susan Brown) (Canadian)

#1121

Even though Tom's parents explain that his claustrophobia stems from a frightening childhood experience, Tom still believes he is a coward because he cannot force himself to crawl through the tunnel in the gorge. With the acceptance of his new rock-hunting friend, Andrew, Tom begins to regain his self-esteem. The unlikely pair of friends combine their talents to sell rock specimens and plants. Both Tom and Andrew have been victimized by the Cobras' bullying tactics; one day the Cobras go too far and toss Andrew's prized fossil into the tunnel. Ignoring all danger, Andrew crawls into the tunnel after it. Tom's courageous rescue of his friend prevents disaster and allows Tom to see that his fear is not cowardice. Excellent potential for discussion about bullies, joint business ventures, claustrophobia, and revenge. Teachers are advised that references to savages and Indian dancing do not comply with selection guidelines, and require discussion.

HOBOKEN CHICKEN EMERGENCY, THE (C. Manus Pinkwater)

#2029

What would it be like to own a unique pet? Arthur finds out when he sets out to buy a Thanksgiving Day turkey and returns home with Henrietta, a live 123 kilogram chicken. Arthur enjoys teaching Henrietta new tricks but Hoboken's other residents consider the huge chicken a frightening sight. A humorous fantasy about a young boy and his incongruous pet.

HOLES (Louis Sachar)

#1196

Stanley Yelnats is under a curse. A curse that began with his no-good-dirty-rotten-pig-stealing great-great-grandfather and has since followed generations of Yelnats. Now Stanley has been unjustly sent to a boys' detention centre, Camp Green Lake, where the boys build character by spending all day, every day, digging holes exactly five feet wide and five feet deep. There is no lake at Camp Green Lake but there are an awful lot of holes. It doesn't take long for Stanley to realize there's more than character improvement going on at Camp Green Lake. The boys are digging holes because the warden is looking for something. But what could be buried under a dried-up lake? Stanley tries to dig up the truth in this inventive and darkly humorous tale of crime and punishment - and redemption.

ISLAND BOOKS #1, 2, 3 (Gordon Korman)

#1508

This kit contains all three books of the ISLAND series. Six kids find themselves shipwrecked on a desert island.

ISLAND OF THE BLUE DOLPHINS (Scott O'dell)

#1124

In the Pacific there is an island that looks like a big fish sunning itself in the sea. Around it, blue dolphins swim, otters play, and sea elephants and sea birds abound. Once, Indians also lived on the island. And when they left and sailed to the east, one young girl was left behind. This is a story of Karana, the Indian girl who lived alone for years on the Island of the Blue Dolphins. Year after year, she watched one season pass into another and waited for a ship to take her away. But while she waited, she kept herself alive by building a shelter, making weapons, finding food, and fighting her enemies, the wild dogs. It is not only an unusual adventure of survival, but also a tale of natural beauty and personal discovery.

JACOB TWO-TWO MEETS THE HOODED FANG (Mordecai Richler) (Canadian)

#1126

As the youngest member of his family, six year old Jacob feels the need to repeat himself in order to be heard. Taken prisoner by the outwardly sinister Hooded Fang, Jacob uses his ingenuity and courage to rescue his fellow prisoners from a fog-ridden island. A funny, satirical adventure.

JESS AND THE RUNAWAY GRANDPA (Mary Woodbury)

#1197

Author: Originally from Ontario, Mary Woodbury moved to Edmonton in the late 1970's and continues to be active in the writing community there. She helped found a book publishing house and a literary magazine as well as the writer's guilds of Alberta and Newfoundland. Woodbury has written several novels for young people.

JESS AND THE RUN AWAY GRANDPA tells of a young girl's journey to understand and cope with Alzheimers that is destroying her beloved Grandpa's memory. Things have been tough for Jess - her cat got run over and her best friend was turning into the class clown.

LION, THE WITCH AND THE WARDROBE, THE (C.S. Lewis)

#1198

The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe is the second of seven books in the Chronicles of Narnia series.

In this novel the battle of good against evil is fought in the magical world of Narnia, in one of the most enchanting fantasy novels ever written.

LITTLES, THE (John Peterson)

#1131

After reading THE LITTLES and getting acquainted with the Little family, students will enjoy reading more about these tiny people. Readers will find out how the Littles got to the city below the garbage dump and what they found when they got there.

LITTLES , THE AND THE TRASH TINIES (John Peterson)

LITTLE HOUSE IN THE BIG WOODS (Laura Ingalls Wilder)

This Laura Ingalls Wilder novel is one of many in a series. Little House in the Big Woods tells of a year in the life of a pioneer family and is told through the eyes of Laura, a six year old girl.

Suitable novel to accompany Pioneer Theme in Grade 4 Social Studies.

LOG HOUSE MOUSE (Sharon Saimon)

#1132

This is a story about two mice who try to make their home in a log house and the perils they encounter. This unit also has specific lesson plans based on multiple intelligences.

LOUIS BRAILLE (Margaret Davidson)

#1133

A simply-told story of Louis Braille, blind from the age of three, who learned to compensate for his blindness through use of his other senses. Frustrated with the tedium of reading from raised-print books, Louis searched for an easier, less expensive writing form. Adopting a system of raised dots, Louis developed an alphabetic code using combinations of six dots. By the age of 15, Louis had perfected his system, but it took 20 more years for the sighted community to recognize its value. This book describes Louis' heroic effort in pursuit of braille writing, his generosity, and his courage in a long battle against tuberculosis.

LUKE BALDWIN'S VOW (Morley Callaghan)

#1203

This Morley Callaghan novel is for and about young people. In this story, Luke Baldwin's father dies of a heart attack leaving Luke an orphan at a young age. Luke goes to live with his uncle, a practical man who believes that dreaming is only for fools. Luke has a tough time adjusting to his new life. Then he meets Dan, an old collie, and discovers that the practical things in life are not always the most valuable. As Luke grows up, he makes a vow that becomes an important lesson of life.

MACAROON (Julia Cunningham)

#1134

This novel is about a girl and a raccoon. The raccoon enjoys the luxury of a child's home for the winter - but finds it hard to leave in the spring. He decides to adopt a terrible disagreeable child to make leaving easier. The girl and raccoon develop a friendship and the girl realizes how terrible she really is!

MAMA'S GOING TO BUY YOU A MOCKINGBIRD (Jean Little) (Canadian) #1204

Jeremy's difficulty in accepting his father's death follows a predictable pattern. When he and his sister are sent to the cottage for the summer, Jeremy feels excluded from his father's affections and fails to acknowledge the seriousness of his father's condition. When his father dies, Jeremy is angry at his loss. He becomes very protective of his father's final gift, a tiny carved owl. Gradually, through reaching out to help a lonely girl in keeping with his father's final wish, Jeremy becomes willing to share his memories. Jeremy finally reaches a state of acceptance symbolized by his generosity in presenting the owl as a gift to his mother.

MAX & ME AND THE TIME MACHINE (Gery Greer/Bob Ruddick)

#1139

This is a witty, action-packed peek at medieval England seen through the eyes of two young time-travellers who look for adventure using Dr. Flybender's time machine. The boys find themselves transported to an era of knights, jousting, and castle intrigue.

MELANIE BLUELAKE'S DREAM (Betty Dorion)

#1140

Author: Dorion was born in Newfoundland in 1952 and graduated from Memorial University. She then spent time on two reserves in Saskatchewan and since 1979 has been a teacher in Prince Albert where many of her students are of Indian and Metis background. Melanie Bluelake's Dream is her first novel.

MELANIE BLUELAKE'S DREAM - ten year old Melanie Bluelake is a Cree girl who has moved away from the northern woods she loves, to a strange city where her mother is completing high school upgrading. Melanie misses her friends on the reserve and fights with her mom for moving her. Most of all, she misses the loving warmth of her Kohkom, her grandmother. This novel is suited to themes on Survival and A Taste of Saskatchewan.

MESSAGE OF THE MASK (Elfrieda Read) (Canadian)

In all the six years that Scott Anderson had lived at Twin Rivers, B.C., with his guardian, Jake O'Brun, Jake had never given him a dull birthday present. And just as wonderful as Jake's gift was the beautifully carved mask from Scott's best friend, Daniel McKay, who had one just like it. Granny McKay tells the story of the powerful masks, and urges Scott to guard his gift well.

MICE AT CENTRE FIELD (Estelle Salata) (Canadian)

#2031

Action abounds in this fast-paced story from the tiny world of mouse baseball. In an exciting fantasy about good triumphing over evil, Benny the Bullet and his team overcome the bullying tactics of the Rink Rats.

MOUSE AND THE MOTORCYCLE, THE (Beverly Cleary)

#1173

This enjoyable fantasy traces the friendship between a young hotel guest, Keith, and Ralph, an extraordinary mouse. Keith's gift of a toy motorcycle allows Ralph many hours of excitement. When Keith falls ill, Ralph risks his life to get medication for his sick friend. A suspense-filled novel suitable for independent reading.

MR. POPPER'S PENGUINS (Richard Atwater)

#1205

Mr. Popper is an absent minded painter who lives in Stillwater. While reading an article about penguins in the Antarctic in the National Geographic magazine, Mr. Popper writes to Admiral Drabe who is on an expedition to the Antarctic. Much to Mr. Popper's surprise he receives twelve penguins from Admiral Drabe. How Mr. Popper learns to cope with his new pets makes for delightful, humorous reading.

MRS. FRISBY AND THE RATS OF NIMH (Robert C. O'Brien)

#1143 & #1218

Mrs. Frisby is a widowed mouse working courageously to move her family out of their winter home before the farmer's spring ploughing destroys it. As her young son Timothy is too ill to move, she enlists the aid of a colony of highly intelligent rats, escapes from a scientific laboratory. The rats befriend her family and are in turn forewarned that their own remarkable home has been discovered. This is an exciting, believable fantasy that enables the reader to view the world from a rat's point of view. Included is an interesting environmental debate concerning the human "rat race".

MY NAME IS PAULA POPOWICH (Monica Hughes) (Canadian)

#1144

Eleven-year-old Paula's mother has decided that they will move to Edmonton. Not until Paula discovers family pictures in her grandmother's attic does she realize that she has much to discover about her father. She is overcome with the need to find him and to learn more about her background through her father's family. However, Paul's mother's unwillingness to be part of Paula's new found identity and her plans to marry Hans leave Paula depressed. Running away appears to Paula to be the only solution.

MY TEACHER IS AN ALIEN

#1206

This novel is the first in the famous series by Bruce Coville. Three kids discover that their teacher is an alien who is about to kidnap some of them for a project back home and the excitement begins.

MYSTERY HOUSE (Jean Booker) (Canadian)

#1207

Mystery House is a Canadian novel in which three children investigating ghostly happenings in an empty house discover real danger. Correlates well with the mystery novel END HOUSE.

MYSTERY AT CRANBERRY FARM (Lynn Manuel) (Canadian) #1208-set 1, #1209-set 2

This is a story of the adventures the Fern children had during summer holidays at their Aunt Daisy's fruit farm near Osoyoos, B.C. Aunt Daisy has been injured in a fall and needs some help around the farm. She invites the Fern children to spend part of their summer holidays with her. Aunt Daisy tells them of the mystery that intrigued Aunt Daisy as a child. Using clues in a story written by Aunt Daisy's grandmother, the Fern children solve the mystery.

MYSTERY OF THE MISSING WILL, THE (Jeni Mayer) (Canadian) #1146

Rumours about the deceased Mrs. St. Vincent and the mysterious business dealings of her family spur Samantha and Meredith to set out to explore the deserted old St. Vincent Mansion. Their curiosity leads them on a personal paper trail to find Mrs. St. Vincent's lost will. Meredith discovers how fortunate she really is.

MYSTERY OF THE TURTLE LAKE MONSTER, THE (Jeni Mayer) (Canadian) #1210

Justin Daniels and his family have a summer cabin at Turtle Lake in Saskatchewan. Tourism in the area is booming with the rumors of sightings of a large sea monster. Justin is sceptical until one day when he sees the monster himself. However, when Justin overhears a conversation that leads him to believe the Turtle Lake Monster is a hoax, he sets out to solve the mystery.

NIGHT OF THE TWISTERS (Ivy Ruckman) #1147

Based on the story of a 1980 tornado that caused extensive damage in Nebraska. This is the fast-paced account of a young boy who, along with his baby brother and best friend, survives the tornado's devastation in a basement shower stall. In the storm's aftermath, the boy becomes separated from his family and rapidly develops self-reliance and maturity as he searches for his parents. A suspenseful novel.

OWLS IN THE FAMILY (Farley Mowatt) (Canadian) #1150

A family that already has a number of strange pets is concerned when Billy brings home an owl. The fun begins when he brings home another owl. The owls, Wol and Weeps, add many delights and problems to the family's life. This book is rich in humour and in affection for animals and the outdoors.

PERFECT SOLUTION, THE (Elizabeth McConell) (Canadian) #1211

What would happen if you found a friendly probe that had been sent to Earth from space? What if others wanted to get their hands on it take it apart? What would you do? The children in the story display intelligence, self-confidence, and caring as they act to protect the probe.

RETURN TO CRANBERRY FARM (Lynn Manuel) (Canadian) #1213

Who is breaking into the fruit cellar at Cranberry Farm? Are Aunt Daisy's best friends plotting against her? And is there a treasure hidden somewhere in the old farmhouse? Tritch, Teddy and Tory play detectives as they set out to answer these questions and solve another exciting mystery at Cranberry Farm.

SADAKO AND THE THOUSAND PAPER CRANES (Eleanor Coerr) #1214

Based on the true story of a courageous young Japanese victim of Hiroshima bombing. Twelve year old Sadako dies of leukemia ten years after the atom bomb has fallen on her city. In what has become a universal symbol of hope and peace, paper cranes are folded by Sadako and her friends. They work to collect the thousand paper cranes tradition has said will grant Sadako's wish and make her well again. Sadako collects six hundred and forty four cranes before her death.

SARAH, PLAIN AND TALL (Patricia MacLachlan) #1155

A Newberry Medal winner. In answer to an advertisement for a wife and mother, Sarah comes on a trial visit to the pioneer home of Caleb, Anna, and their widowed father. The children discover that Sarah, who describes herself as plain and tall, is a very special person capable of bringing music and laughter back into their lives. Sarah loves the sea. The children hope that she can find beauty in the prairie landscape as well, and that she can learn to love them all as they love her. A short, gentle story with well-defined characterization.

SEARCH FOR ELIZABETH (Helen Perrin Clarke) #1159

A "Saskatchewan based novel" by a "Saskatchewan author" - a perfect novel for the Grade 7 theme "A Taste of Saskatchewan".

Author: Helen Perrin Clarke, lives near Arborfield. After retiring from a teaching career, she turned to writing. Search for Elizabeth is her first novel. She is working on a second and has plans for a third book in the Elizabeth series.

SEARCH FOR ELIZABETH is a story of twelve-year-old Elizabeth Drake who lives in Saskatchewan during World War II. Her mother's death causes a rift between Elizabeth and her father, and Elizabeth rebels against the traditional female role of the 40's.

With her horse and dog as companions she is willing to try almost anything to prove who she is and to regain her father's love. Her vivid imagination and impulsive behavior keep her in constant hot water.

SECRET OF SUNSET HOUSE, THE (Sharon Siamon) (Canadian) #1215

This sequel to A PULI NAMED SANDOR contains further adventures of the Richardson family. Mr. Richardson has purchased the old home at Beach Lake where the children had stayed when they had become lost the summer before. The family plans to fix up "Sunset House" and use it as their summer vacation home. It's a summer of mystery and adventure as the children discover that they are not the only residents in the house.

STRANGE LAKE ADVENTURE (Sharon Siamon) (Canadian) #1216

Strange Lake was the name of the northern Ontario mining town where the Savela children lived. Their strange and exciting adventure began one cold, February morning. All their lives they had heard about Howie Stern, the Prospector. Howie had a cat, Toby, and a car that the queen had ridden in. He lived all alone in a log cabin out at the old Martin Bird mine. Because their father couldn't go, the children were taking Howie's supplies out to him. They were travelling through the bush on their father's new snowmobile. The real excitement begins after the children meet the old prospector.

STONE FOX (John Reynolds Gardiner)

#1217

Little Willy's grandfather is sick, and it's up to Willy to save their farm from tax collectors. Their only hope is the prize money from the National Dogsled Race. But a lot of other people want to win the race, too, including Stone Fox, who has never lost a race in his life. Do Willy and his dog Searchlight stand a chance against the toughest racers around? Can they win the race to save the farm and Grandfather before it's too late?

SUMMER OF THE SWANS, THE (Betsy Byars)

#1165

Sara's fourteenth summer is not a happy one--no one understands her, she's not pretty and she has to look after her retarded brother. Sara takes Charlie, her brother, to watch the swans. That night Charlie leaves the house to find the swans, and gets lost. From this troublesome time, Sara learns what it means to care about someone else.

SUPERFUDGE (Judy Blume)

#2035

This sequel to Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing contains further adventures of Peter and his mischievous younger brother. With a new baby on the way, Peter considers moving away from home.

SUSPICION ISLAND (Jeni Mayer) (Canadian)

#1166

"Stay away from this island..... danger...." Young Daniel's grandfather is missing. Daniel is determined to find his grandfather. This teenager meets several suspicious characters, and is really concerned about strange episodes on the Island. Will Daniel be able to solve the mystery and return home safely? This novel can be used to supplement "Environment Theme" as well as "Mystery Theme".

TALES OF A FOURTH GRADE NOTHING (Judy Blume)

#2032

The comic adventures of Peter and his mischievous little brother, Fudge, are recounted in this episodic novel. Fudgie is an incorrigible child who throws temper tantrums, scribbles on his brother's homework, and hides Peter's pet turtle. Peter's difficulties with Fudge provide hilarious fun.

TIMOTHY OF THE CAY (Theodore Taylor)

#1168

This is the sequel to The Cay in which young Phillip Enright ends up on a deserted island following a shipwreck. There he meets 70 year old Timothy and together they spend three months on the island. Timothy dies and Phillip is rescued.

Timothy of the Cay tells more about Timothy's life on the island before his fateful meeting with young Phillip and what happened to Phillip after he was rescued from the tiny island.

TO THE MOUNTAINS BY MORNING (Diana Wiener) (Canadian) #1509

The story is set at a riding stable in the foothills of the Canadian Rockies. The central character is Old Bailey, a wise old chestnut quarter horse. All the other horses admire and respect Old Bailey, with the exception of Stocking, a handsome young horse who makes fun of her. The central problem arises when Mr. Cuthbert, the new owner of the stables, arrives to take over the business. Cuthbert's regime includes painting the whole ranch yellow, installing new and higher fences and sending away old and unattractive horses. An air of menace and tension pervades the scene.

TOILET PAPER TIGERS, THE (Gordon Korman) #1170

Strike one. Strike two. This team is out out to lunch, that is!

Corey Johnson never dreamed that Little League could be so humiliating. But that was before he joined the Feather Soft Tigers. It was bad enough that the team uniforms had pictures of toilet paper on them -- thanks to their sponsor. But with a catcher who's afraid of the ball, a right fielder who falls asleep during the game, and a coach who knows zero about baseball, it looks like the Tigers are going straight down the toilet!

A delightful, humorous story by Gordon Korman. Suitable to accompany a Sports theme.

TROUBLE WITH HERBERT, THE (Theodore Taylor) #1222

There are some very special children in The Class: Rachel Rushaway (the fastest girl in the school), Biffo the Bully, Brian Brainbox and Colin Crybaby. But probably the most important member of The Class is HERBERT – a guinea pig with a mind of his own.

TUCK EVERLASTING (Natalie Babbitt) #1223

Doomed to-or blessed with-eternal life after drinking from a magic spring, the Tuck family wanders about trying to live as inconspicuously and comfortably as they can. When ten-year-old Winnie Foster stumbles on their secret, the Tucks take her home and explain why living forever at one age is less a blessing than it might seem. Complications arise when Winnie is followed by a stranger who wants to market the spring water for fortune.

TUNNELS OF TIME (Mary Harekin Bishop) #1221

Thirteen-year-old Andrea doesn't want to go to Moose Jaw for her cousin's wedding, and she certainly doesn't want to hear about some dumb tunnels from the old days. But then she winds up in those mysterious tunnels and discovers she's travelled back to the dangerous past. How can Andrea outwit the gangsters who rule this underworld full of secrets? And how can she ever find her way back to the present?

TWO AGAINST THE NORTH (LOST IN THE BARRENS)

#1202

(Farley Mowatt) (Canadian)

This survival adventure by Farley Mowatt tells of two boys, James MacNair and Awasin who struggle to survive in the barren lands of the Canadian North. Jamie is a white boy recently arrived in the North and Awasin, his Cree friend is not only “opposite in appearance” but more mature in his judgements and actions. Although closer in instinct and culture to the ways of the North, he is nevertheless high-spirited enough to find himself constantly forced into unwise acts through the recklessness of his friend. The result is that they are both stranded in the northern barrens in the face of impending winter, with nothing between them and death but their own courage and ingenuity. How they meet that challenge makes irresistible reading.

RUNAWAY TO FREEDOM (UNDERGROUND TO CANADA) (Barbara Smucker)

#2034

Julilly has been cruelly separated from her mother and sold to a harsh slave owner in the deep south. Drawing on her mother's instructions and the help of the underground railway, she escapes with Liza, another young slave who has become crippled from repeated beatings. This emotionally-honest tale written with deceptive simplicity, depicts problems that led to slave escapes, charity extended by abolitionists, especially the Quakers, and adjustments to a life of freedom in Canada. This novel set has an accompanying video tape.

WRINKLE IN TIME (Madeleine L'Engle)

#2033

In this Newbery Award-winning science fiction, three children travel, using a wrinkle in time, or tesseract, to the planet of Camazotz, where their father has become trapped. The unfortunate inhabitants of Camazotz carry out a synchronized existence under the evil influence of “It”. Aided by three women with supernatural powers, Meg, Charles Wallace, and Calvin confront the source of evil. When Charles Wallace attempts to use reason as a weapon, he too is captured. Meg realizes that the only power stronger than “It” is love. An exciting, multi-layered story with religious overtones. For better readers.
